## **Notes from LM**

Nominations Committee: The names of Jo Teakle and Nan Dower were brought forward for appointment to Nominations Committee. For the next eighteen months John Cross has additional commitments with the Archive and Study Centre in connection with the Heritage Lottery project, and so expressed a wish to stand down. We thanked him for his service. Philip Paull agreed to act as Convenor for Nominations Committee and to represent us at Area Meeting. The nature of Quaker links with universities is clarified in a document from Friends House, and the Nominations Committee and Elders have had detailed discussions about a representative from Cheltenham LM, and will be carrying this forward.

Quinquennial Survey: Report from Premises Committee: The surveyor had spent half a day at the Meeting House, and indicated that the property is generally well maintained. However, it could benefit from a professional spring clean to deal with items such as kitchen hygiene and the walls. Some problems had arisen out of the installation of the new boiler, and the heating contractor will be contacted about this. More urgent work that will need attention within the next year includes the overhaul of roof covering and flashings, the cleaning and repair of gutters and mending cracks in the boundary wall.

Becoming Friends: Several Friends have expressed interest in forming two study groups to work through "Becoming Friends", a package intended primarily for enquirers, but also valuable for established Friends. A sign-up list for those interested will be put up on the notice board, and Friends will also be able to purchase a copy of the text at £10.

A Men's Group: It was agreed that the possible formation of a Men's Group open to the whole Area Meeting would be announced at Area Meeting, and those interested are encouraged to contact Mike Lang.

Quaker Song Book: Maureen Steffen reminded us that our Meeting had purchased a number of copies of the Quaker Song Book, and Friends are asked to return any copies they have as soon as possible.

Area Meeting, Thursday 10<sup>th</sup> June: The Clerk expressed her gratitude to those Friends who had come forward to take on the various jobs involved in hosting Area Meeting.
