GREEN DOORS

Our Meeting House is one of the buildings open for the fifth Cheltenham Green Doors open homes and gardens event. Sixteen homes, gardens and community properties will be opened to the public over the **weekend of 12 - 13 September 2015**. They will all give lots of ideas about how to make positive changes, both big and small, in the way we live so that we can all do our part in combatting what has been described as the biggest threat to our civilisation.

Our Meeting House will be open on Sunday 13 September between 1.00pm and 4.00pm and we will be offering refreshments. If you can help with this, please contact Alison Crane or Ann Caro.

Technologies on view will include solar PV and thermal panels, both external and internal insulation, draught-proofing, LED lighting, biomass boilers and air source heat pumps. Sustainable garden features will include rainwater harvesting, planting for pollinators, organic vegetable growing and keeping bees and hens.

The great advantage of the event is that you can get friendly, impartial advice from people who've tried and tested the different systems and can discuss them with you at leisure without trying to make a sale. You'll be able to check out the visual impact of a range of features on many different types of buildings, including several period houses.
